Like many new Australians, Mr. George Broekhuysen arrived from The Netherlands to settle here and found his plans unfeasible in the light of circumstances he had not known at home. He decided to go into business for himself however, and after starting a flourishing window cleaning enterprise on Sydney's North Shore, gave it up to conduct a fruit and vegetable delivery run. Then he got the bright idea of converting half of his home on Pittwater Road, Dee Why, into a little corner of Holland. Here, it is possible to buy every type of Dutch souvenir, food, newspaper and a variety of items just as popular with Australians as former Dutch residents.
