# Secretary's Annual Report

---

I have much pleasure in presenting my report of the Boomerangs year 1970/71 which, I feel sure, you will agree, will go down on record as the year in which we expanded in all directions.

During the year under review the usual three functions were held at Marrickville and 3 at Forestville. The fact that we had capacity houses for all 6 functions and could have easily sold far more tickets if only we had had suitable accommodation, proves that the popularity of the Boomerangs and their functions continues to increase to such an extent that we sometimes have to pay the price of our success by disappointing those people who supported us in days gone by.

During the year a new system was devised for the allocation of tickets and whilst this procedure resulted in assuring that associate members would receive tickets ahead of anybody else, the system is far from ideal. However, until such time that we can locate a suitably located hall with increased capacity, this problem will remain with us.

In addition to the normal functions, a very successful picnic day was organised in October, at which our associate members and their families were invited. That our picnic became an outstanding success in spite of the incessant rain only proves that we have the resources to make last minute alternative arrangements which, under the circumstances, proved successful.

A significant growth factor in the year nearly behind us was the increase in associate members. We commenced this year with 121 associate members and at the time of writing this report, 248 are on our books. Together with this increase we substantially increased the number of travellers we were able to send to Holland on group and charter flights organised by "The Link". This resulted in substantial additional income to the Society which, through no fault of our Treasurer, is not revealed in his financial report as the cheque was received by me today.

Since the 1st January, travel arrangements were entrusted to Swire & Gilchrist in accordance with the Boomerangs policy of giving support to those who support us. So far we have reason to be satisfied with arrangements made and a recent agreement with our travel agents has ensured further support from them which will be reflected in our income for 1971/72.

During the year we welcomed the following new members:

Mr. M. de Gier, Mr. P. Marignissen and Mr. H. Buskes, who, in the short time they have been with us, already proved to be assets to the Society.

No members resigned during the year and our total membership now amounts to 25 members, all of whom contributed to the success of our functions during the last year.

In November we "buried" our Prince Tieske who acquitted himself of his high office in a manner which drew the enthusiastic support of all his Subjects.

We were very fortunate in finding such an able successor in Hans 1. It will now be left to the new committee to select our next Prince and the support and assistance of all active members will be needed in this difficult task.

Our quarterly publication "The Boomerang" again improved considerably in appearance and lay-out during the year. Unfortunately, editorial material was sadly lacking and the thankless job of producing a readable "Boomerang" was left to all too few. I appeal to all members to forward suitable material to the Editorial Committee, which we will be electing later tonight.

Mr. Rob de Rooy and Mr. Wim Claessen took office for the first time this year and proved that they had sufficient interest in the Society to give it all the time and energy required of committee members. It is again disappointing to see that whilst there is no lack of criticism on the part of members as to what the committee does do, and does not do, should have done, or should not have done, too few members make themselves available for election.

Whilst generally I dislike singling out one single member for fear of overlooking the valuable work done by others, I should like to think that you will all agree that our success would not have been as great as it is if it had not been for the untiring efforts of our Treasurer. Only those who served with him fully realise the mammoth task involved in acquitting himself of his task in the manner it is done by him.

In conclusion I would like to give my personal thanks to all Boomerang members for their friendship during the past year. Let us continue to find pleasure in the success of our functions which, after all, is the only reward we obtain for many nights of hard and sometimes thankless work. Let us continue to put this hard work into the Society that is so dear to all of us and let no stone be left unturned to work together in complete unison to achieve even greater results in the Boomerangs year which is about to begin. \*
