

Willem Van Otterloo

Distinguished Dutch conductor Willem van Otterloo has returned for his third season as Chief Conductor of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

His association with Australian orchestras began in 1962. Since then he has led the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra on an outstandingly successful tour of the United States and last year took the Sydney Symphony Orchestra to the Orient and later, on its epoch making highly acclaimed eight week tour of the United Kingdom and Europe.

In November 1974 he took up his first term as Chief Conductor of the Dusseldorf Symphony Orchestra.

Mr. van Otterloo studied at the Conservatorium of Amsterdam and since then has conducted many of the worlds leading orchestras in Europe, America and Japan during a long and illustrious career.



Michel Beroff

French pianist Michel Beroff, currently making his first ABC Australian tour, may only be 25, but he plays with the complete maturity of a seasoned virtuoso.

His meteoric rise to the international touring circuit began in 1967 when he was awarded first prize in the covetted Olivier Messiaen Piano Competition at the Royan Festival.

It was as a gifted interpreter of 20th century and avant-garde piano music that Michel Beroff first gained attention in the musical world and while continuing as a noted interpreter of recent music he has gained a wide reputation with his performance of the classical and romantic repertoire.

In 1970, Mr Beroff gave the first and complete London performance of Messiaen's Vingt Regards sur L'Enfant-Jesus in addition to several appearances throughout Europe with the BBC Symphony Orchestra and Pierre Boulez.

The following season saw Mr Beroff working with the Orchestra de Paris under Ozawa and the London Symphony Orchestra under Bernstein in several piano and orchestral works by Stravinksy, a composer with whom he shows a deep affinity.

His American debut followed in 1972 with Bartok's *Piano Concerto No.2* in association with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra and Pierre Boulez.

Later that year, he toured Germany, performing Ravel's G Major Concerto with the Orchestre de Paris under Sir George Solti.

Just prior to his Australian tour, Michel Beroff performed in London with the BBC Symphony Orchestra under Colin Davis and in New York with the Orchestre de la Suisse Romande under Sawallisch.
