A lot of emigrants who arrived during the time we were at the Hostel from April 1971 till February 1972, did not speak a word of English, I just wonder how they got on with this form. Also a copy of Personal Issues.

Once a week the women would bring their towels and bed sheets to one of the large sheds and get issued with fresh ones, as well as toilet paper. It always tickled me seeing these people walking around with heaps of toilet rolls. I am sure a lot of people did not know what toilet paper was for as a number of new arrivals did their washing in the communal toilets which had to be "unblocked" all the time.


If you had an open mind and could see the funny side of things you had a good time at the Hostel. Never a dull moment. Some people never stopped complaining and returned home to Australia's benefit, I'm sure. Mind you, on the day we arrived I could have cheerfully turned around and gone home on the first flight available.

After a long flight with many delays on the way, we eventually arrive in Brisbane from London via Melbourne. It's hot and we have to walk a mile from the plane to what looks like an army shed. I wear a long camel coat, baby in one arm, suitcase in the other. My husband also wears an overcoat and carries two suitcases with a five-year-old in tow. We are loaded onto an old and dilapidated bus that is held together by the layers of dirt both on the inside and the outside. It was so dirty we could not see through the windows without wiping it with something and only then we got a dim view.

We got out of the airport and passed some old wooden sheds on poles and I wondered what they were used for. In my mind I thought they were places were animals were kept. Eventually we arrive at the Hostel. Dehydrated, hungry and tired only to find that we were not expected for some reason or another. Hence there was not a hut ready for us. We waited and stood under the shade of a tree until we were given a wooden hut. There was no bed, so we waited and waited till eventually a "put you

up" was found and we could move in. I opened a drawer and was welcomed by the biggest cockroach. I just screamed. By then, we had missed the dinner session so no food or drinks till the next morning.

We decided that there must be a restaurant near and walked outside the gate of the Hostel in search of a place to eat. The stench in the air outside was so strong that we thought that the sewerage must run onto the street. So we walked back in. (We did not know that there was a pickle factory close by and if the wind was in the right direction the pong was unbearable). We knocked on the neighbour's door and a German couple made us a cup of tea. I really did not know what we had let ourselves in for. Things got better after our first day.

When our first Christmas in Australia came around (1971) we all felt very depressed. Everybody felt homesick, missing mums and dads and brothers and sisters and friends at home terribly. We all spilled a few tears in quiet moments and wished we were back home.

The heat made it worse as we all associated Christmas with cold weather and cosy nights around the fire. The Christmas atmosphere eluded us totally. All of us who had nowhere to go on Christmas Day are forever grateful to the Manager, Mr Bale, and staff at the time for the wonderful Christmas Dinner they provided. We were all
