

Past and present

The time that the Rembrandt Club resided at Lee Holm Drive was coming to an end. The building where the Rembrandt Dutch Club would be staying next until 2019 was at 87 Dunheved Circuit. At that time Rembrandt only rented part of the building. To change this old factory into a typical Dutch lounge room, a lot of people were involved, and we remember that one of the members even took 6 weeks long service leave. It was a coincident that our business Tulip Upholstery was in the little building on the same property. Imagine the surprise when Jan met these Dutchies working next door. Every day we would go and look at the progress of the improvement to the inside of the building and so make it a permanent home. Jan was handed a key with the words: you can keep an eye on this for us. The bar was the main feature and it looked amazing. The kitchen was small with one domestic stove and a sink. No shop for now. The billiard tables stood on the right hand side of the one and only main hall. The stage was on the left hand side. When there was a dance night it was usually the young ones that were seated at the billiard tables. I did hear some complains about this: why do we have to sit uncomfortable?? The events that were organised always involved club members and their family. It was not until about 1982 that "strangers" were welcomed. To keep this club going we had to broaden our horizon. I remember one board member in particular who was very much against opening the door to the wider community. In 1981 the Federation of Netherland societies called a meeting of all affiliated Dutch organisations

In 1981 the Federation of Netherland societies called a meeting of all affiliated Dutch organisations in NSW to start a new project for the Dutch community. A subcommittee was formed to start working on a Dutch Festival. Jan was one of the four persons that formed the executive committee. In February 1982 the first NSW Holland Festival was held at Fairfield showground. This was an opportunity for all Dutch organisations to get involved and raise money for their own club. The Rembrandt Club has been involved from day one. Be at either a bar (one year with a dance floor and own stage) or a 'touwtje trekken' (pull a string) stall.

I remember in 1988 when Queen Beatrix and Prins Claus visited the Festival in Fairfield, their entourage all had a go at pulling a string and most of the royal party wanted to win a giant dummy. It was great fun on a 'ROYAL' level.

Back to the first years in Dunheved Circuit; the floor in the main hall was covered in vinyl tiles and looked cool rather than warm and homely. So, one Friday night it was discussed amongst members that this could be improved. I can say that one member spontaneously grabbed a bucket and went around the hall. The end result; a new floor covering of Heuga carpet tiles was ordered and Jan, being a floor layer by trade, was the first volunteer to put his hand up for the job.

The opening hours for the first years were; Tuesday and Friday nights only. During dance nights the club operated with a function licence.


