





- (2) A candidate, though successful, cannot be appointed after he attains his sixteenth birthday.
- (3) A candidate passes this examination if he secures at least half marks in Handwriting and in Spelling only; but those who have also gained half marks in Arithmetic at this examination will, if appointed, be *eligible* for promotion to a higher position in the General Division without further examination in these subjects.

- (5) Unless a Telegraph Messenger receives promotion to a higher position before reaching the age of 18 years, he must retire from the service on attaining that age.
